One of Zimbabwe's most gifted cricketers, Henry Olonga, will be talking about his sporting career, escape from Zimbabwe, faith and singing career at 'An Evening with Henry Olonga' **July 3<sup>rd</sup>** at South Sheffield Evangelical Church.

Henry became famous for wearing a black armband during a cricket World Cup match to protest Mugabe's Government policies. He was arrested for treason after releasing a statement objecting to the lack of democracy in his country and forced to flee, ending his cricket career. Henry now lives in England.
