DIOCESAN STRATEGY?

The Diocese is pushing forward a strategy to reduce the number of fulltime Vicars from 106 to 75 by the year 2025 as a direct response to the financial deficit in the Diocese. The 'new model' is basically that unpaid church workers (lay/ordained) will be identified to run each church. There will be an Oversight Minister for around 3 or more churches and a mission area. Deaneries would merge together and there will be full time 'Super Area Deans'. It is not clear

what this will all mean in practice, but it is a direction of travel for the diocese. Now is the time to think seriously about this... offer constructive criticism and may be suggest new ways forward. More details from www.sheffield.anglican.org/consultation2019 (there are also a few paper copies)
