## Will Aid

---

Making a Will is the only way to ensure that your money and possessions go to the people and causes you care about. It may surprise you to know that in a 2010 Will Aid poll, nearly 50% of

people mistakenly thought their estate would automatically go to their partner when they died.

The charities which benefit includes Christian Aid, Save the Children and NSPCC.

How Will Aid works

- Solicitors across the UK donate their time to support the Will Aid charities.
- Instead of paying them a fee for writing a basic Will, you are invited to make a donation to the Will Aid charities instead.
- Suggested minimum donations are £40 for a codicil, £75 for a single Will or £110 for a pair of mirror Wills.

Please book your appointment as soon as possible. Will Aid solicitors are in great demand during November and the sooner you book the better!
