Deanery Synod – World Church

On Thursday evening, the Ecclesall Deanery met (here at St Marys) to listen to speakers about the church's mission around the world. Archdeacon Martyn Snow told us of his upbringing as a child of missionaries and his time at a church in Guinea, and some honoured guests from an Anglican church in Cape Town talked about their church experience – their church has an active link with Holy Trinity, Millhouses. St Marys were well represented, and Odette provided information about her situation.

The Diocese of Sheffield's Environmental Group is holding a series of lectures to encourage Churches and individual Christians across the Diocese to care for the environment.

This year the environment lecture series entitled 'The Economy: Servant or Tyrant?' will feature guest speakers from the New Internationalist, the New Economics Foundation, and Transition Towns and Faith perspectives.
